

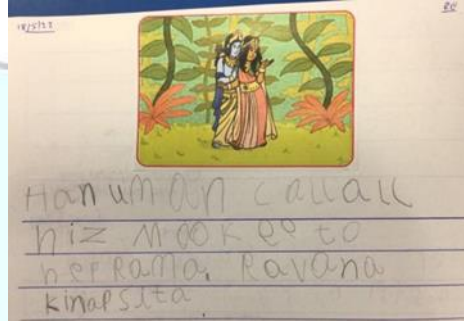

Reception

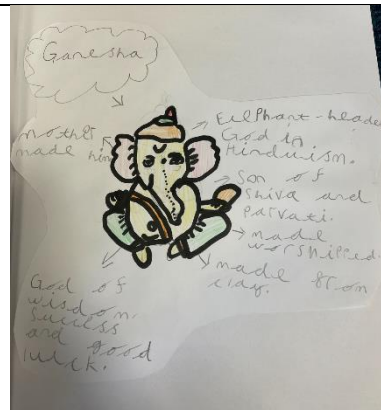
In EYFS we have been looking at the story of Rama and Sita. We retold the story to our partners using simple sentences. We then acted out the story using puppets and then wrote all about it in our Literacy books.



YEAR ONE

In Year 1 we have been looking at Hindu Lords Ganesha and Krishna. The children loved learning about Ganesha and his elephant head! We also looked at the similarities and differences between Hinduism and Christianity.





YEAR 2

In Year 2 we have been learning about Puja, the act of worship for Hindus. We have learnt about the shrines that many Hindus have in their home, which often include a puja tray. We made our own puja trays, thinking about the important items that they contain and how these items link to our different senses.



YEAR THREE

In Year 3 we have been learning about a Hindu's special place of worship, called 'a Mandir'. What makes a Mandir special to Hindus?

We have been learning about the inside of a Mandir, there is a special religious book called a 'Vedas', a shoe rack because shoes cannot be worn inside the building. A bell is rung to let God know that people are entering the building. There is a shrine in the middle of the room and people bring offerings to God.

Year 4

Year 4 have been learning about Hindu's special books. Hinduism does not just have one sacred book but several scriptures. Hindus read and study them as part of their worship and the contents of these books guides their lives.

	<p>The two oldest books are 'Vedas' meaning knowledge and 'Bhagavad-Gita meaning song of the Lord.</p> <p>We looked at two stories 'The Beggar Man' and '6 Blind Men and an elephant'. We learnt that Hindus search for truth in their stories.</p>
<h1>Year 5</h1>	<p>In Year 5 we have been looking how Hindus believe in Brahman and the belief in one God. We have been looking at how Hindus believe that Brahman takes on many visible forms and how all the Gods and Goddesses represent different aspects of Brahman. We have also been focusing on how many Hindus take on a pilgrimage and how this is an important part of their lives.</p>
<h1>Year 6</h1>	<p>This week Year 6 talked about what life was like as a Hindu. We watched videos to learn about the religion and talked about key vocabulary.
