YEAR THREE

Year 3 have been learning about mosques and some of the rituals that Muslims take part in. We identified the different parts of a mosque, both inside and outside.

When learning about different rituals, we explored the importance of doing 'Wudu' before praying to Allah.

Year 4



Year 4 have been learning all about 'Holy Books' in our Islam Faith Week. We have learnt how important the Qur'an is to Muslims and how carefully they hold it.

We learnt that Muslims read the book from right to left and they learn the important messages off by heart.

We learnt that Allah is God and is also known by 99 other beautiful names.

On Tuesday 5th March, Year 4 visited Clitheroe Mosque. They were welcomed by Imam and Farouk and were taken on a tour of the mosque. They visited the 'Ablution Room; and learnt why it is so important for Muslim's to prepare themselves for praying. They learn all about the Qur'an in the main prayer room.

Year 5

In Year 5 this week we have been looking at how the people of the Islamic Faith put their Faith into action. Year 5 have discovered this is done through prayer, fasting, charity, possession of faith and pilgrimage. They have also looked at Ramadan and how this is integral to the Islamic Faith. Why it is done and how it impacts their lives.

Year 6

In Year 6, we began by doing a general overview about the five pillars of Islam before zooming in on Zakat, the third pillar. We had a valuable discussion about whether Zakat was fair, before doing a poster/explanation of the beliefs behind it.

Write in the 5 Pillars of Islam with an explanation of what each one means.

Hajj
Hajj is where every good Muslim has to go to Mecca once in their lifetime if they can afford it. This is a very important time in their life.

Sawm
Sawm is when Muslims fast during Ramadan each year. It is a time to have discipline and respect. It is when Muhammad received word from Angel Gabriel.

Zakat
Zakat/Zakah (you can call it either) is when you donate to people less fortunate than you to show how lucky you are.

Salah
Salah is where Muslims must pray 5 times a day. Before the sunrise comes up, at 12:00 noon, in the late afternoon, sunset, and between sunset and midnight.

Shahadah
Shahadah shows that you are a good Muslim. It is a statement almost like a prayer. It is said that if you see three people in front of the Shahadah then you can become a Muslim.
