## Year 6 ~ STEM Challenge



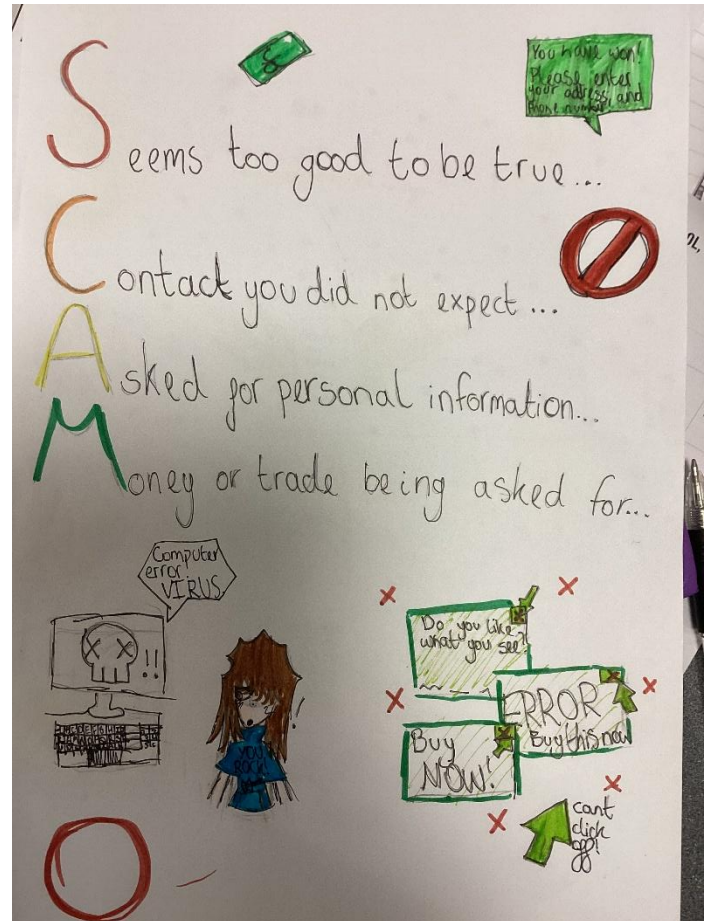
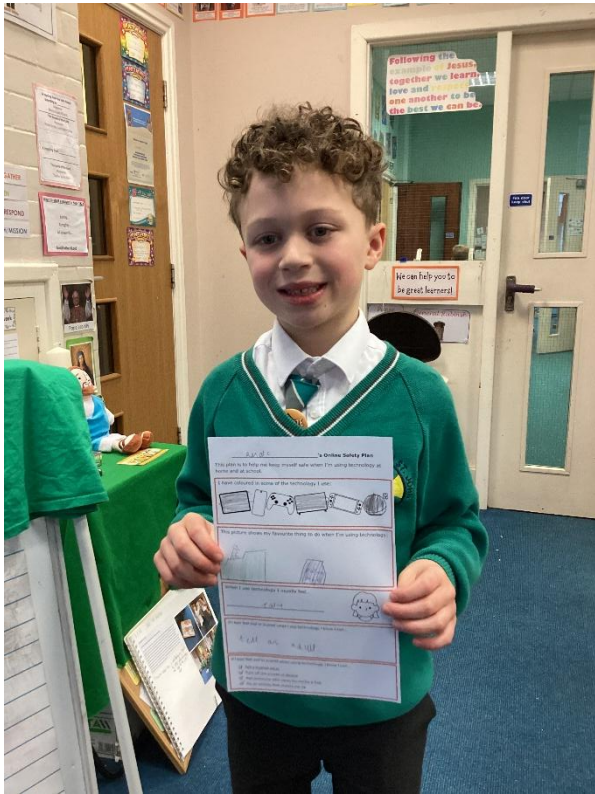

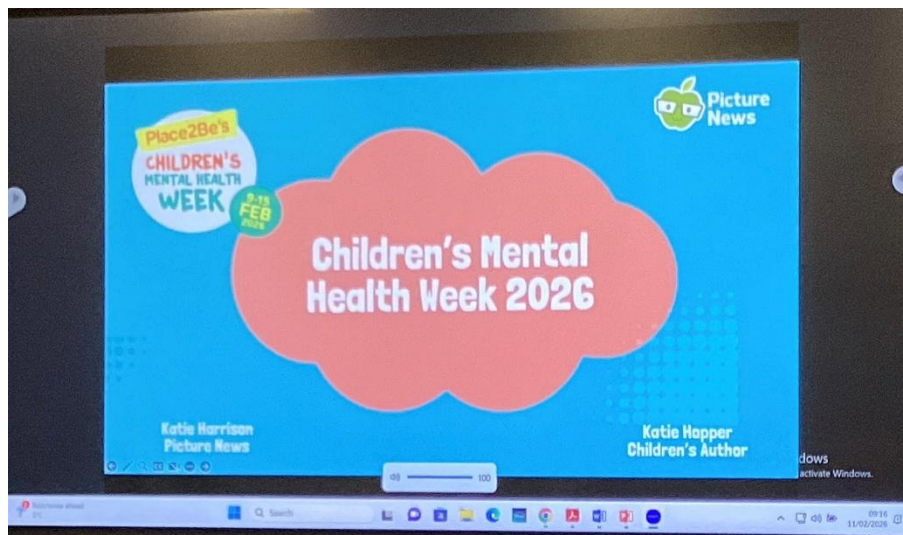
### Dogs on the School Site

## Online Safety - Life Online

We held an internet safety workshop on Tuesday. Here are the main takeaways:

### **Keeping Our Kids Safe & Happy Online**

### **A Parent's Quick Guide to Digital Wellbeing**

#### **1. The "Golden Rule" of Devices**

The most effective safety feature isn't an app—it's a location.

- \* **Keep it Central:** Ensure tablets, consoles, and phones are used in communal family spaces.

- \* **The Sleep Sanctuary:** Set up a "family charging station" in the kitchen or hallway. No screens in bedrooms after 7:00 PM. This prevents late-night scrolling and "blue light" sleep disruption.

#### **2. Check the Rating (And the Reality)**

- \* **PEGI Ratings:** These tell you if the game content is age-appropriate (violence, language).

- \* **Social Media Ages:** Most apps (TikTok, Snapchat, Instagram) have a minimum age of 13. This is because their algorithms and data tracking are not designed for children's developing brains.

- \* **The "Human Factor":** A game might be rated for ages 7+, but if it has live chat, your child is exposed to adults. Remind them: "If you wouldn't talk to a stranger on the street, don't talk to one in the lobby."

#### **3. Build a "Digital Safety Net"**

Technical controls are great, but they aren't foolproof. Your child's best filter is you.

- \* **Be Curious, Not Furious:** Ask your child to show you their favorite game. Let them teach you how to play. If they feel you are "on their team," they will come to you when something goes wrong.

- \* **The "Ugh" Rule:** Tell them: "If you see anything that makes you feel 'ugh' (scared, weird, or confused), tell me. I won't be mad, and I won't just take your phone away."

#### **4. Essential Conversation Starters**

Try asking these this week:

- \* "What's the coolest thing you saw online today?"

- \* "If someone was being mean in a game chat, do you know how to block them?"

- \* "Is there anything you wish I understood better about [Roblox/TikTok/YouTube]?"

\* Common Sense Media: Great for checking if a movie or game is actually okay for your child's age.

\* Internet Matters: Step-by-step guides for setting up parental controls on your specific home Wi-Fi or consoles.

### **Please find details below of some Lancashire County Council run courses/events which you may find useful.**

Please note: You will need to book on to attend via the links below each course/event.

#### **Riding the Rapids (5-11 years)** - at Clitheroe Family Hub Starting 14/4/26

Riding the Rapids is a free course designed for parents and carers of children who are autistic, on the pathway for autism assessment or who have significant learning disabilities or other complex disabilities. The course aims to help parents to understand and support their child's well-being, and reduce stress, distress and distress-related behaviours, or other behaviours of concern.

Parents and carers develop strategies through discussion, direct teaching, practising ideas and watching videos of young people and other parents talking about their experiences. Parents and carers put strategies into place between sessions.

Once you have booked onto the course, all parents/carers will be contacted prior to the sessions starting to ensure that Riding the Rapids is a suitable intervention to meet your child's needs. It is also an opportunity to ask any questions and for us to get to know you and your child.

#### **Riding the Rapids: [LCC Events](#)**

#### **Triple P Group** - Delivered virtually starting 15/4/26

For parents of children aged 2-11 years old, this involves 6 sessions (4 weekly, 1 weeks of telephone support then a final week). It is delivered through group discussions, parent workbooks and homework.

The course will assist if you have specific concerns about your child's development or behaviour. You are most likely to benefit if your family is not complicated by significant behaviour problems or stress.

The course covers:

Positive Parenting - using assertive discipline, having reasonable expectations and looking after yourself as a parent.

Raising confident, competent children - showing respect for others, being considerate, having good communication and social skills, having healthy self-esteem, being a good problem solver and becoming independent.

Raising resilient children- recognising and accepting feelings, expressing things appropriately, building a positive outlook, developing coping skills, dealing with negative feelings, dealing with stressful life events.

### Triple P Group - LCC Events

**Positive Relationships Stronger Families** - delivered virtually starting 25/02/2026

The sessions will help you understand:

Why you may have fallen into a pattern of destructive conflict.

The effects of this on your children's health, wellbeing and educational attainment.

How relationships go through a set of stages as they develop and how we can often move up and down those stages over time.

How our past and what we bring to our relationship, including existing vulnerabilities can make us more susceptible to conflict

How arguments and disagreements can be constructive or destructive

How easy it is to misunderstand each other

How we can communicate better- exploring expectations against reality and setting goals
